
Core Competency Resources

Communicating Student Learning

One of our priorities this year is to begin to shift from the reporting of student progress at various "fixed intervals" to communicating student learning (CSL) on an ongoing basis. Many CISPG educators are currently using a variety of media to communicate with parents about their child's learning. But how do we make sense of what should be communicated? Kelli Vogstad is a prominent BC educator who has written several excellent articles in her blog, Teaching and Learning With Heart. In one of her posts, she talks about Making Learning Visible and Digital Portfolios, (click the underlined links) a must read for anyone using Fresh Grade or moving to student portfolios. She refers to 4 kinds of documentation: Two of the Same, Showing the Knowing, Celebrating The Learning, Communicating the Hows and Whys. • **Dr. Schonert-Reichl** is a world-renowned expert in the area of social and emotional learning (SEL). Her work includes ways in which SEL programs such as Roots of Empathy, MindUp, The Taxi Dog Educational Curriculum and the Kindness in the Classroom Curriculum result in changes in self-regulation and stress among children in typical classroom settings.

• **Sister Eva Solomon**, a Roman Catholic Sister of St. Joseph, is director of the "Building Bridges" Project, a program that focuses on the bringing together of Christian faith and Aboriginal traditional ways. She has worked with Christian denominations across the country as they look at the question of "interculturation" of Faith.

• **Brent Davis** is the Distinguished Research Chair at the University of Calgary. The principal foci of his research are teachers' disciplinary knowledge of mathematics and the structures and experiences that might support mathematical learning among teachers.

• **Dr. Todd Whitcombe** is an Associate Professor at UNBC. For the past 25 years, he has been involved in a number of Science promotion activities, most notably Science Alliance with Exploration Place and Active Minds (SUNY) at the University of Northern British Columbia.
