## Focus on the Foundations 2018-2019

As part of our CISPG Learning Plan, we will focus on the foundations of the redesigned curriculum in the coming year - specifically literacy. Each school has been gifted a set of core literacy resources written by Miriam Trehearne to support primary classrooms: Multiple Paths To Literacy (K-2), Kindergarten Teacher's Resource Book and Language Arts Grade 1-2 Teacher's Resource Book. You may wish to refer to these excellent books when designing your primary program through the year.

As well, attached to this email are two primary resources for further reference: Literacy Essential Learning by Nancy Reid, SD #57; and Phonological and Phonemic Awareness Curriculum Maps by Linda O'Reilly, Educational Consultant. Both documents are very helpful in terms of making explicit the "essential" literacy skills in grades K-3 and key resources that support early learning.

## Classroom Assessment and Reporting

The latest CISPG Communicating Student Learning (CSL) Guidelines document for 2018-2019 has been sent to schools. This document will also be available on our CISPG website shortly. The CISPG Guidelines document was accompanied by the "Delta Benchmarks" for the core subject areas of literacy, numeracy, social studies and science. The Delta documents are very helpful for considering student learning "benchmarks" (they work really well enlarged to 11X17). They can also be found on the CISPG website.

As well, the BC Ministry of Education has recently released new materials that are aligned to the redesigned curriculum model and support classroom assessment: <u>Classroom Assessment Resources Package –</u> <u>English Language Arts</u>; <u>Classroom Assessment Resources Package – Math</u>; <u>Classroom Assessment Resources Package – Science</u>; and <u>Classroom</u> <u>Assessment Resources Package – Socials</u>.
