

Looking forward to the 2020-2021 Calendar year, UNBC invites you to consider being a Coaching Teacher to their Teacher Candidates (TC's). UNBC School Of Education offers four practicums throughout the Bachelor of Education degree. The first practicum (Ed 390) is observational. The second (Ed 391) is experiential and consists of three weeks of one-on-one between the TC and the Coaching Teacher. The third practicum (Ed 490) is formative and is four weeks in length. Here, the TC works with the Coaching Teacher and a Practise Evaluator (a representative of UNBC). The fourth and last practicum is summative. Over a period of approximately ten weeks, the TC once again works with a Coaching Teacher and a Practise Evaluator from UNBC.
