- The dove could mean peace, the Holy Spirit, or even remind us of the dove from Noah's ark that went **seeking** to find safety, refuge, or a place for a new beginning
- The Holy Spirit reveals all truth
- The cedar branch is a symbol of **healing** for Indigenous people, it is also an evergreen which is the symbol for life
- White can be a symbol of purity or joy
- Red is the colour for the Holy Spirit, but also for love
- Pink is another colour for joy
- The circle represents God who has no beginning and no end




