

## Rationale

Catholic Independent Schools Diocese of Prince George (CISPG) recognizes its responsibility to promote a healthy lifestyle in the form of a smoke-free environment for the health and welfare of students, staff, and any other person.

CISPG recognizes that the Legislature of British Columbia has passed Bill 10 – Tobacco Sales (Banning Tobacco and Smoking in Public Places and Schools) Amendment Act, 2007, Tobacco and Vapour Products Control Act, and "Tobacco and Vapour Products Control Regulation".

## **Procedures:**

- 1. Smoking and the use of tobacco products including vapour products is prohibited on all School property by students, staff, and any other person, except as set out in Article 8.
- 2. "No Smoking" signs shall be posted in all facilities of the Catholic Independent Schools Diocese of Prince George.
- 3. Users of rental or leased space in the school facilities of the Diocese are to be advised of this policy.
- 4. If a staff member fails to adhere to the administrative policy, the immediate supervisor shall undertake progressive discipline.
  - a. The staff member will be informed of the policy and encouraged to adhere to it.
  - b. The staff member will be given verbal warnings on failure to adhere to the policy.
  - c. The staff member is given a written letter of reprimand with a copy to their personnel file.
  - d. If a staff member continues to fail to adhere to the policy, the immediate supervisor shall refer the matter to the Superintendent of Schools.
- 5. In addition, no student shall possess tobacco products or vapour products on school property.
- 6. If an adult possesses tobacco products and/or vapour products on school property, he/she shall not smoke or otherwise consume same on school property.
- 7. If a student fails to adhere to this administrative policy the principal may take disciplinary action as deemed appropriate in the circumstances.
- 8. The use of tobacco products is permitted for Aboriginal ceremonies.
