

INDIGENOUS UNDERSTANDING




INCLUSIVE EDUCATION

Curricular competency: Think critically, creatively, and reflectively to explore ideas within, between, and beyond texts.		
Think	You process ideas from multiple sources, considering multiple <u>viewpoints;</u> You ask questions You represent' share your ideas in some way so you can eventually connect them, sort <u>them;</u> You consider broad ideas and details and connecting these ideas to your existing knowledge.	
critically	You evaluate information (credibility, accuracy) You consider the source - and the reason something was created You are evaluating biases (within the text or within yourself) You are clear about your purpose for consuming a text	
creatively	You are taking risks to think differently, and explore You are seeing more than what is there in front of you - inference, ideas generating You make personal meaning from the text (emotional, experiential) You look for insightful meaning and ideas within the text You imagine possibilities (elternate endings, new characters)	
reflectively	You identify what you are bringing to the text when you read it (background information, connections) - there is an element of personal connection. You think about your thinking - how you connect, why you connect in the ways you do, what values are impacting your interpretation, what assumptions are affecting your interpretation.	
within	You are thinking about things that are directly within whatever it is you are reading, seeing or listening to Your details and ideas refer to the text.	
between	You connect one text to another (or several others). You are looking for similarities and differences.
